

Choosing life

Easter is early this year falling at the end of March and by the time you read this letter we will be two weeks into the season of Lent

For Christians, Easter is about life – the resurrection of Jesus which conquers death and brings hope. Many other people, however, celebrate with eggs and chocolate, a bank holiday and perhaps a family get-together, even if the religious aspects of the season pass them by.

Whatever their faith or lack of faith, most people want to live a good life, and Easter can be a time for us all to think about whether the way in which we live is life-enhancing or life-denying. Every day can be seen as a new chance to choose which of these two paths we are going to take.

A life-enhancing approach is about making the most of every day. People who live this way are the ones who bring joy to others, who act out of love and service. They see the good things in life and revel at the beauty of creation. They live loving lives and look beyond their own needs and desires.

The life-denying people are only concerned for themselves. What they value tends to be the material – money, a fast car – and their time is usually taken up doing things for themselves. They pick holes in everything and always see the worst in people.

Of course, most of us fall into both of these categories at different times in our lives, even from day-to-day. Perhaps the message of new life at Easter can prompt us to look at our lives and reflect on whether we can be life-enhancers more of the time. Some people find this easier than others, but all of us can make life better for others and for ourselves by choosing where our priorities lie.

We all have a choice about how we live. People often give up things for Lent; perhaps this year we could think about taking something up for Easter. In fact, why wait till then? Every day can be a new beginning. And even small acts of kindness can make a huge difference to someone else's life.

Thank you that, just as after winter comes spring and after night comes morning, so, most gloriously, after death on Good Friday, comes resurrection on Easter Day!


Christ is Risen - and we can know, by the indwelling of his Holy Spirit, that He is risen indeed!

MOTHERING SUNDAY

Mothering Sunday, the 10th March and the fourth Sunday in Lent, is the day for honouring our Mother Church, and has been celebrated since the Middle Ages.

Mother's Day is an annual day to honour our mothers, and it began in America in May 1907.

In the US, Canada, Australia and Mexico, Mother's Day is still held in May. In Britain, Mothers' Day is held on Mothering Sunday, so the two days are often merged in people's minds.

If you ask Google for ideas of how to be nice to your church on that day, you won't find much. But if you want to be kind to your mother that day, you will be spoilt for choice. High on all the lists are suggestions for taking her to lunch, giving flowers, a card, or paying for her to have a day doing something she loves.

Whatever you choose to do, probably the best thing to give your mother must surely be yourself: some time and some love. Remind her of the funny and touching stories of your childhood and thank her for all the things that she did for you. Give her some good company and show her some gratitude. Let her know that you love her and appreciate her.

Remember that the Commandment 'Honour thy father and mother' was the first commandment that came with a promise of blessing on you, if you obey.

Hurworth Churches Working Together Honest to God

Even if you do not in any way go near a church or a church service or even connect to a Higher Power in whatever name you may use, Lent as a period of time for renewal is a good idea.

What is Lent? On the surface folk might think it is a time to give up things-give up chocolate, give up a certain unhealthy habit, or to stop being so anxious or angry. These are good things to explore but Lent offers more than that.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (Valentine's Day this year) and runs till Easter Sunday with the admonition to "remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return."

Sounds complicated...but actually Lent is a period of time where we are encouraged to be honest. Yes! Honest.

- Honest about how you are doing.
- Honest with yourself about what is going on in our lives.
- Honest about how you really feel.
- Honest about the losses we did not have time to grieve and the traumas we did not have resources to heal before.
- Honest about any uncomfortable feelings or patterns of harm in your life.
- Honest about our lack of peace.
- Honest to God.

Did you know there are strong links and roots between being **human** and being **holy, honest**, and **humble**?

In the Christian faith tradition, the way Jesus lived offers rhythms of a different paradigm during Lent. Rhythms of living that welcome the mourner, which bless the weak, that gives space and voice to lament. A time where we strongly encourage being human, and in being human to be honest and humble and even holy.

For me, Lent it is a time to slow down and practice the 3 Rs before Easter: Time to **Reflect.** How am I doing, how is my family doing? What am I worried about? What fears consume me at this time?

Time to **Repent.** Where are the unhealthy patterns in my life? Am I taking care of the resources of the earth? Could I live in ways that are far healthier for the environment and for others?

Time to **Reconcile.** With whom do I need to repair relationships? Am I worried about something, and with whom am I angry?

Hope this is helpful for life as we head towards Easter


