Thought for the Month

Why do we believe what we believe?

Recently, some of us in the Riverside Parishes have been reading a book together about how Christianity has shaped our culture. In the ancient world, people believed that some people are worth more than others, that slaves belong to their owners, that there's no point looking after people at the bottom of society, and that the past was better than the present. But that's not what we believe. We believe in equality, freedom, compassion and progress. Why? The answer in the book: our modern values come directly from Christianity. (If you want to check out the book, it's by Glen Scrivener, and it's called, The Air We Breathe.)

But there's something very strange about saying that Christianity has shaped the modern world. Right at the heart of Christianity is a man on a cross. Christians claim that the man on the cross was and is the Son of God. Now, if you were going to invent a religion, never in a million years would you think of encouraging people to worship someone on a cross. Being crucified was the most humiliating thing you could possibly imagine. No self-respecting deity would sink so low!

But there's no doubt that, at some point in the past, people started to worship a man called Jesus, who they said had been crucified. Why would people do something so strange? Something must have happened. But what? What happened?

The answer that Christians give is that Jesus came back to life again, and that he's alive today. Only someone who is alive can transform the world and transform lives.

If you want to encounter the risen Jesus for yourself, why not give church a try? It might be the best thing you've ever done.

Autism is on the rise

Autism is on the rise. Or at least, the recognition of it is. According to the website psychcentral.com, there was a 787% exponential increase in the number of people who were diagnosed with autism between 1998 and 2018 in the UK. The National Autistic Society says that in the UK, more than one in every 100 people are now on the autism spectrum. It reckons that around 700,000 adults and children in the UK suffer with the condition to some degree.

All of which means that you probably know of someone who has autism, to some degree. And you may know that, as it says on the NHS website:

Autistic people may act in a different way to other people, ... and find it hard to understand how other people think or feel. They may find things like bright lights or loud noises overwhelming, stressful, or uncomfortable. They may get anxious or upset about unfamiliar situations and social events and take longer to understand information.

To help people with autism, you may wish to support this 'acceptance week', by going to the National Autistic Society's website, <u>https://www.autism.org.uk</u> and taking part in some way in their fundraising campaign.

The **Hurworth Youth Project** is the umbrella name for various youth work activities in the village of Hurworth (and surrounding area) run by local charity Darlington Area Churches Youth Ministry.

For over seventeen years All Saints Church has proudly supported (and been the location for) the **'FRIDAY NIGHT DROP-IN'** a place for young people (in school Years 7 to 11) to come and socialise with their friends offering a range of activities including pool, air hockey, a computer suite, quiz nites, craft activities and a low-cost tuck shop / refreshments. Although the Drop-In has recently had a short hiatus it runs every Friday during term-time from 7.30pm to 9.30pm.



There is also a very popular younger version of the Drop-In, called the **'FRIDAY NIGHT HANG OUT'** which is for Primary School pupils in years 4, 5 & 6 that runs from 6pm to 7.30pm. The young people enjoy socialising and the array of activities available. In February the group decorated stones for Valentines Day, which were then placed around the village for people to find.

There is an entry fee of $\pounds 1$ to each of these sessions - that goes back into the running of the youth activities.

Earlier this academic year members of the Hang-Out went to Marrick Priory near Reeth for a QUEST weekend. The young people enjoyed activities including zip-wire, climbing wall, abseiling and the legendary 'Leap of Faith. Much fun was had.

Alongside the organised activities on Friday evenings, we also have the **'FRIDAY NIGHT WALKABOUT'** which is when members of the team walk around the village to engage with, and chat to, any young people who may simply be hanging around – you may have seen us with our bright hoodies and beanie hats.



The other significant activity of HYP is the provision of '**THE LISTENING POST**' work in Hurworth Academy. The Listening Post is a listening and mentoring service that provides low-level mental health and well-being support and is part of the wider Listening Post work across Darlington. Last academic year we held over 295 listening post appointments supporting 36 students.

ABBA 50 Years On

Fifty years ago, on 6th April 1974, the Swedish pop group ABBA won the Eurovision Song Contest with their song *Waterloo*. It was the first time that Sweden won the contest. ABBA went on to be one of the most successful groups in music history.

The victory, in Brighton, was just the first step on the road to conquering the world, as far as pop music was concerned. The songs, written mainly by Björn Ulvaeus and Benny Andersson, were matched by the passion, exuberance and good looks of singers Agnetha Fältskog and Anni-Frid 'Frida' Lyngstad, who later married them – and even later, divorced them.

The name of the group came from the initials of the four Christian names. Some have suggested a link to the biblical Abba and looked for Jewish themes in their songs, but this is wishful thinking. While Anni-Frid (who was born Norwegian) may be Christian, Björn is definitely an outspoken atheist. In fact, ABBA is the name of a Swedish canned fish company that had to give permission for the singers to use it – a decision they are unlikely to have regretted.

Both *Waterloo* and ABBA achieved worldwide superstar status quickly – no small feat for a group performing in a language that is not their own. The film *ABBA* – *the Movie* and the musical *Mamma Mia* and its sequel, featuring their compelling songs, were huge successes. It is estimated that the musical has been seen by more than 60 million people worldwide.

ABBA hit the jackpot again when their revolutionary new project, *ABBA Voyage*, launched in 2022. In it, Agnetha, Björn, Benny and Anni-Frid perform their love-songs digitally with a live 10-piece band, in a purpose-built ABBA arena at Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park in London. Not bad for four divorcees in their 70s.
