My garden lifts my spirits every single day and although I never seem to have time to sit in it, it is once again my happy place. I have stopped worrying about the weeds that creep under the shrubs despite a covering of forest bark and, although I cannot seem to make my peace with dandelions or that sticky goose grass stuff I am beginning to feel that a weed is in fact a plant 'growing in the wrong place'. Some of them are even guite pretty.

It strikes me that nowadays we are all under pressure to be perfect. Have perfect bodies, perfect homes, a perfect lifestyle. We are expected to be perfect parents, perfect partners, even perfect cooks. I see evidence of this everywhere. Eating disorders, personal debt, burn out and stress at work.

Could there be a message in what I learnt in my garden? Not everything has to be perfect. My garden is still a place of joy despite its imperfections. Perhaps it's time that we stopped tormenting ourselves by trying to be perfect and celebrate instead that we are human, part of God's creation, most wonderfully and marvellously made.

Diabetes timebomb: NHS to offer 'soup and shakes' diet

The NHS is to roll out a 'soup and shakes' diet across the UK, aimed at the tens of thousands of patients who are fighting Type 2 diabetes.

Health officials said every part of the country will be offering the regime by next March, as the NHS tries to tackle what has been called Britain's 'diabetes timebomb'.

Pilot schemes report an average of two stone in weight loss in three months. Clinical trials seem to show that this will be enough to reverse about half of diabetes cases. The 'soups and shakes' diet is a 'total diet replacement' product, which aims to deliver 800 to 900 calories a day for 12 weeks.

Professor Jonathan Valabhji, the NHS England's national clinical director for diabetes and obesity, says: "Research is clear that weight loss, where indicated, goes a long way to helping people stay well and avoiding preventable illness, and in many cases, it can be the trigger for putting Type 2 diabetes into remission.


